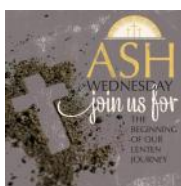

Greetings in Christ!

It has been a very quick month of January for me. February is here and it is time to look at what comes next. On the 18th, it will be Ash Wednesday.

That seems to come quicker every year! The beginning of Lent is an important time for people of faith. Lent has no beginning in Scripture, it is something the church created, which is why many of our Christian brethren do not participate in it, but it serves a valid purpose. Lent was instituted to help all of us focus on what Christ did to redeem us from our sin.

Jesus endured great pain, suffering and torture prior to even being nailed to the cross. As it says in Isaiah 53:5, "But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed."

Jesus paid the price you and I owe for our sins. In Romans 6:23, we read, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Jesus died for your sins, he suffered great pain, torture and ultimately death because you and I cannot stop sinning. Jesus died on the cross because he loves us. John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." And yet, Jesus said we are not friends, we are His brothers and sisters. If He loves his friends enough to die for them, how much more will He do for His brothers and sisters?

Jesus not only died that we might be redeemed, but He then rose from the dead and fixed it so you and I can live forever! Lent was created so we would remember what Jesus did for us on the cross. His life, death and resurrection were what the Father asked Him to do for the benefit of you and me. We can never repay it; we can never earn it; we can only accept it as the gift it is.

This is why the church invented Lent; to remember what Jesus did for us! Jesus love is a gift that keeps on giving. Salvation is the first and most important part of the gift, but the gift is so much more. It is joy, peace, love, patience, kindness, gentleness, and self-control. May we always remember this, not just during Lent, but throughout the year.

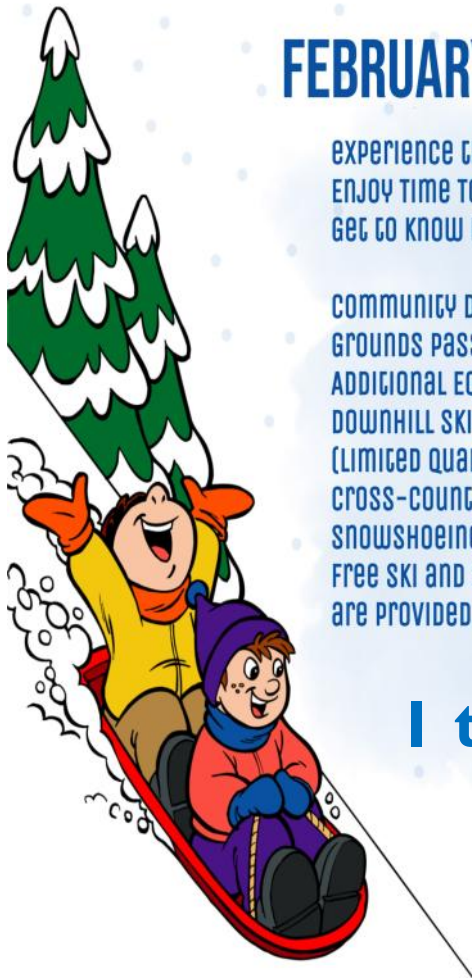

2026 Mission Trip to Barnesville, MN July 19-25.

Who can go on the trip? Any youth currently in 6th grade-adults. Applications are found on the bulletin board. Application and a \$50 deposit are required to reserve your spot. Experience the land of 10,000 lakes in Barnesville, Minnesota—a friendly town of 2,600 residents just 25 minutes from the Fargo-Moorhead metro along I-94. Nestled on the edge of the Red River Valley, Barnesville is surrounded by scenic farmland, rolling hills, and nearby lakes. While the community is rich in pride and tradition, many residents—particularly seniors and low-income families—face challenges maintaining safe housing.

Throughout the week, we will serve families in need by completing meaningful home repair projects they couldn't otherwise afford. These may include building wheelchair ramps and handrails, repairing or reconstructing porches, weatherizing homes and trailers, painting (both interior and exterior), light carpentry, and skirting to protect against the elements. Each project offers a hands-on opportunity to demonstrate compassion and make a lasting impact in someone's daily life.

While working on residential homes will provide the opportunity to serve others in Christ's name there are many opportunities for spiritual growth on the trip for everyone as well. If you are on the fence about going, feel free to attend a planning meeting to ask questions, meetings are the first Wednesday of each month. If you have questions, talk with Jenny Nieman.

Adult Renewal Opportunity- Via de Cristo, March 5 to 8 at Forest Springs, Westboro.

Via de Cristo Retreat Via de Cristo (VDC) is a Spanish phrase

meaning "Way of Christ." VDC is a highly structured three day weekend designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people and bring them to a new awareness of living in God's grace. It's three days in length, beginning on Thursday, March 5 and ending on Sunday, March 8. The participants live, study, worship and commune together daily. Fourteen talks are given, nine by lay people and five by clergy. Following each talk, small round table discussions focus on the main points of the talk and a poster is done. The talks, in an overlapping fashion, present the Christian life, based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. There is music and singing, food and fellowship, a time for laughter and for prayer. This spring, VDC is held at Forest Springs, Westboro. Applications are in the brochure rack, they are due back to Pastor Ritchie, Jenny Nieman, or Rudy Nieman by February 10. If you have any questions talk to them as well.

JOURNEY TO THE CROSS

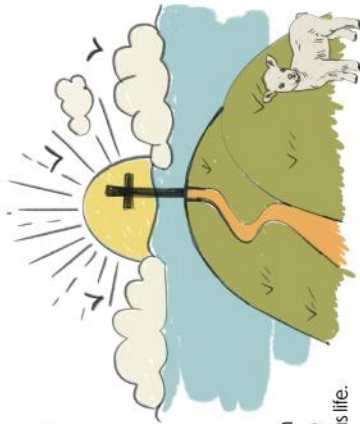
Starting on Ash Wednesday, the church traditionally observes Lent, a 40-day period of repentance and reflection. As we prepare for Easter, families can focus on Jesus' life and ministry, culminating in his death and resurrection.

Use this Lenten Bible Reading Plan, along with a kid-friendly Bible version, for family devotions. With older kids, you can expand the readings to the surrounding paragraph or chapter. Discuss how each reference to Christ ties into God's plan of salvation.

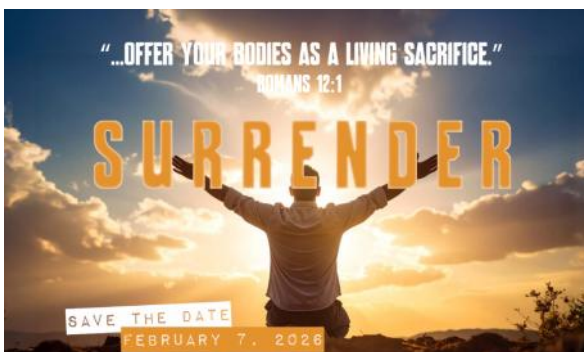

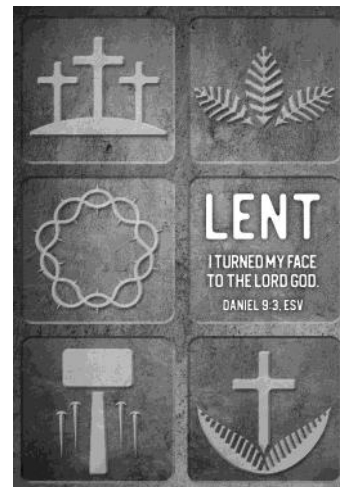

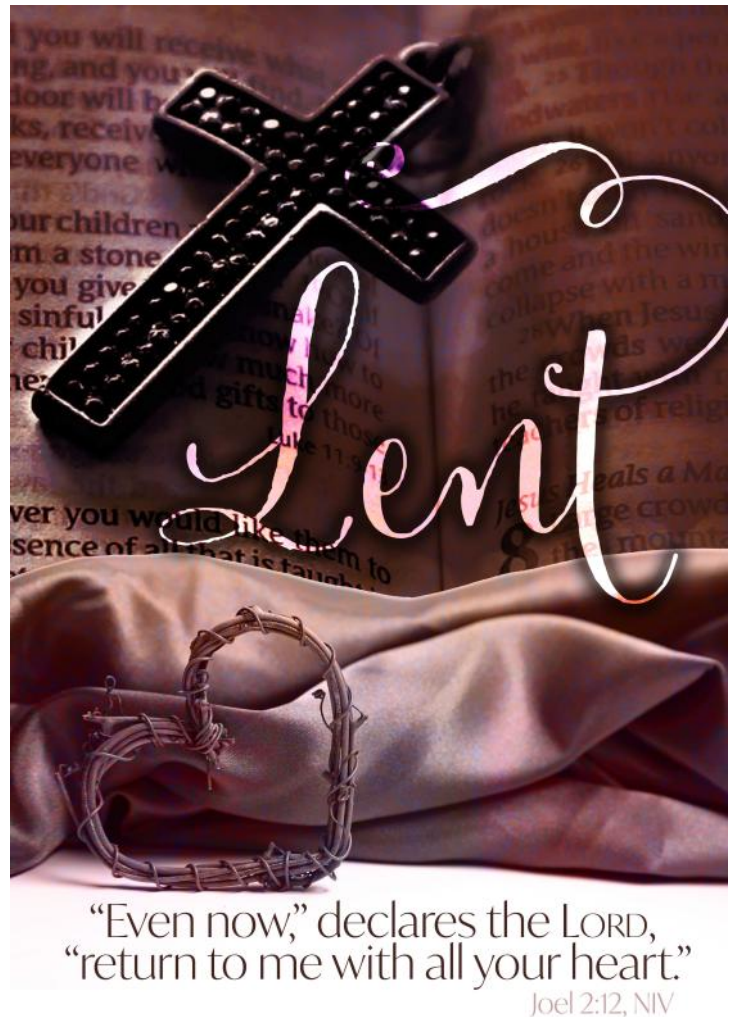
