## AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM



#### Affirmation of Baptism April 28 at 9am.

We will be celebrating with high school students who will be affirming their faith. Be sure to be in worship on Sunday, April 28 to support these young adults as they proclaim and take ownership of their faith. We'll have refreshments following worship to celebrate this special occasion.

#### What is the Affirmation of Baptism process?

Knowledge is important- but knowledge alone is not the essence of the Christian faith. A thorough process of teaching the faith will involve all the senses and more. Although classes and meetings conducted for the purpose of learning about the faith do have an important place, these are not the only ways in which faith is received. The life of faith must be communicated and learned in a variety of ways in diverse settings-through home and congregational life.

Young children often have an opportunity to grow gradually into an entire congregation that lives the Christian faith. The youngster who goes to Sunday school is also invited to take part in other dimensions of

the church's life- worship, activities, and informal gatherings. Sometimes these activities take place only among others their own age, at other times they are part of a much larger group.

In families that participate regularly in congregational life, the family itself is frequently the most influential teacher of the faith. A youngster has the opportunity to learn each day from a parent or another significant adult what faithful living is about. Meal prayers, bedtime prayer, scripture reading, and the practice of religious customs and rituals communicate the faith through speaking, hearing, smelling, touching, tasting and seeing. The home provides the daily context through which the faith is experienced.

Growing up in the faith means coming into contact with a wide network of believers as children enter into the faith community. Here is an important parallel: what is accepted as a given for young children who enter the faith (i.e. the importance of family and congregational life) also needs to be provided for people who come into contact with the church at later points in life. Older youth and adults also need the many contacts the Christian parish provides as they enter into Christian community themselves.

#### **Moving toward Affirmation of Baptism**

The question asked of those wishing to affirm their baptism is: "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear his Word and share in his supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth? "This question is asked of the group and it is expected that each youth is intending to keep these promises by living each of them out by coming to worship regularly, take communion, live out their faith in their lives Monday-Saturday, serve the communities they live and work in and concern themselves with peace and justice in their lives and communities.

## DO SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDIES MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

READ HOW THESE FOLKS ANSWERED THAT QUESTION......

Why small group bible studies? Well, why not?

Small groups are a time of fellowship to study God's Word, voice concerns, ask questions, share what may be on your heart, or be lifted up by others when you are feeling down. I remember my first study when I was afraid to even ask a question. I was nervous and knew nothing about the Bible. I had never read it at that point, yet I knew something had changed in my life and I wanted to know more. I committed to a two-year study and my faith and relationship with Jesus grew, as well as establishing many other relationships within our congregation. You can ask many people that attended that study, and they would likely tell you it didn't take too long before I began to open up, ask questions and even share. I no longer worried if my answer or comment might be wrong because I realized that is how we learn, and no one was there to judge anyone. I thought I would feel intimidated being in studies with other more experienced members, but they only brought encouragement, and a wealth of knowledge and insight to the study.

You don't have to know the Bible, that's the purpose of the small group studies. When we show up, we are all saying, "I don't have all the answers, but I'd sure like to know more." You don't have to feel pressure to say anything, just feel free to soak it in and get to know our amazing God and His Word. It's a great way to start navigating and familiarizing yourself with the Bible. Take our recent study on Habakkuk. I had no idea that many of the same questions we often ask, have already been asked many times throughout the Bible. Check out Habakkuk's conversation with God as he asks questions and God responds. We may not always receive answers or like the answers we do receive, but we can be assured, just like Habakkuk, that God is on the throne and in control. We learned the writer of Psalm 73 also had many of the same questions until he entered the sanctuary of God and could see from an eternal perspective.

With so much unrest throughout the world today, reading and studying God's word together is a great way to draw closer to God and each other. "Together" is the key word because we will always be stronger together. Join us and learn of God's unconditional love, mercy, grace, and the extreme measures He will take to draw us back to Him. It doesn't get any more extreme than sacrificing your son for the sins of the world.




## DO SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDIES MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

#### READ HOW THESE FOLKS ANSWERED THAT QUESTION......



Why join a Bible study? Hmmm. For years—from childhood through much of adulthood, I had only a superficial insight into the Bible. I believed the main message of the Old Testament was that God had provided the Law to His people, and that getting them to obey that Law was hopeless because of their repeatedly falling back on their sinful nature. And I concluded the New Testament's message was that God was "trying a new tack"—Love—as a means of reaching His people. What I had always thought couldn't have been further from the truth. I learned in Matthew 5:17 that Jesus says: "Do not think that I have come to abolish Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them." Through studying the Bible, I've come to see the integral relationship between the Old and New Testaments—between the prophecy in the Old and the fulfillment in the New. I've come to understand the Old Testament as the "Letter of the Law" and the New Testament as the "Spirit of the Law." And, in that context, each book of the Bible makes clearer not only where Mankind has been but where it is in its journey on the way to Eternal Life—what to do to get there and the joy that awaits them! 
