CHURCH BOARD:

- 1. The Church Board serves as the Nominating Committee
- 2. The Church Board shall appoint or hire the treasurer.
- 3. The Church Board shall have general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life, to the end that everything be done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ. The duties of the Church Board shall include the following:
- To lead this congregation in stating its mission, to do long-range planning, to set goals and priorities, and to evaluate its activities in light of its mission and goals.
- To seek to involve all members of this congregation in worship, learning, witness, service, and support.
- ◆ To oversee and provide for the administration of this congregation to enable it to fulfill its functions and perform its mission.
- To maintain supportive relationships with the rostered minister and staff and help them annually to evaluate the fulfillment of their call or employment.
- To be examples individually and corporately of the style of life and ministry expected of all baptized persons.
- To promote a congregational climate of peace and goodwill and, as differences and conflicts arise, to endeavor to foster mutual understanding.
- To arrange for pastoral service during the sickness or absence of the pastor.
- To emphasize support of the church wide association Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC) as well as cooperation with other congregations, both Lutheran and non-Lutheran.
- To recommend and encourage the use of biblically based program resources.
- To seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel.

ELECTED CHURCH BOARD POSITIONS:

At the Annual Meeting, we will elect 3 Spiritual Care and 3 Liaisons. They will appoint amongst themselves who will serve for 1 year, 2 years or 3 years. Moving forward in 2027, one person will be elected for each.

Spiritual Care: (3-year term)

One Spiritual Care person is appointed the chair.

Building Maintenance; Lawn Care/Snow Removal;

Cleaning Staff; Technology.

Accept and disperse undesignated memorials donated to the congregation.

Financial Secretary (3-year term)

Create a counting committee team. The couniting committee team and the Financial Secretary will receive, count, and deposit all incoming contributions. The Financial Secretary documents the contributions

Cemetery Committee Member (3-year term)

Govern the cemetery association in accordance with the duties outlined in the St. John's Lutheran Church Cemetery Association Bylaws.

ADDITIONAL VOLUNTEER POSITIONS:

A Coordinator is needed for each committee as well as volunteers to serve on the following committees and as part of the Counting Committee.

A **Worship Coordinator** shall create a team to include the organist, and the person responsible for writing the order of worship. The team works with the pastor to prepare and organize meaningful worship services that inspire, uplift, and encourage both believers and non-believers. This includes communications and coordination of the various elements of worship including training and scheduling of persons serving in worship; communion setup; technology; music; decorating and worship arts; helping with the planning and coordination of ecumenical worship services; and maintenance of musical instruments. Provides monthly reports to the Spiritual Care members.

A Congregational Care Coordinator shall create a team to work with the pastor to provide care for membership of the congregation, especially lapsed members, and those in times of need or transition; connect with visitors and un-churched and assist with orientation and assimilation of new members. Provides a monthly report to the Spiritual Care members.

A **Food, Fellowship and Fun Coordinator** shall create a team to initiate, plan, coordinate and strengthen activities that build stronger relationships within the congregation. Provides a monthly report to the Spiritual Care members.

A **Beyond Our Doors Coordinator** shall create a team to help members of the congregation have an outward focus to understand and respond to the needs within the community, the nation, and throughout the world so that the congregation can demonstrate God's love and serve those in need. Provides a monthly report to the Spiritual Care members.

A **Buildings and Grounds Coordinator** shall work closely with the Liaisons and be responsible for the care, maintenance, and improvement of the church's facilities and grounds to ensure a safe and well-maintained facility. Provides a monthly report to the Liaisons.






