Friends In Christ,

Can you believe February is ALREADY here!? If we were driving as fast as we are completing days, surely we would get pulled over for speeding:).

In less than two weeks, Ash Wednesday will be marking the beginning of an early season of Lent! Interestingly, it falls on the same day as Valentine's Day this year, February 14th.

Valentine's Day was originally a day commemorating a 3rd-century saint, who was beaten and beheaded for believing in and sharing the message of Jesus! As Jesus says, "There is no greater love than to lay down your life for your friends" (John 15:13). Over time, the day was commercialized, secularized, and trivialized into fleeting forms of romantic love. Surprised?

In Revelations 2:4-7, Jesus tells Christians to return to their 1st love by turning from sin back to him, the one who gives the tree of life! Christian love is an unconditional commitment to the well-being of others. It is not fleeting, but enduring! Maybe through the alignment of the holidays, God is saying he Loves us, and giving us a chance to choose to love him anew?

Lent is an opportunity to choose loving Jesus through personal prayer. Prayer is communicating with God and has a way of changing us for the better, helping us to cope more effectively, to tune us into what God is doing in our lives or trying to teach us. This year's Lenten Wednesday night services are being designed to help us learn to and practice prayer in non-threatening ways, meaning you will not have to speak in front of everyone alone:). We will be encountering Jesus in the story of his suffering and death on our behalf and discovering he is with us in suffering! Through personal prayer, we can experience an emotional connection with God that will help us face the challenges we are going through!

Some have said to me, we are out of the habit of participating in church from our Covid-era years. During Covid, whether right or wrong, many were essentially forced to start a habit of isolation. Habits take time to form. What if you chose to use this Lent as an opportunity to form an old habit that used to help you and those around you, participating in the life of your church!?

Lent has just 6 Sundays between Ash Wednesday (2/14) and Easter (3/31). Please consider challenging yourself to commit to the habit of participating in church during these weeks. It is enough time to form a habit according to various studies. The Scriptures tell us not to give up the habit of meeting together as church, for it is good for us as well as the others present (Hebrews 10:25). I hear people expressing sadness in missing one another. Your very presence is a gift:). Church is about giving as much as it is about receiving. It is about serving as much as it is about being served. When we share in both aspects, everyone is encouraged and grows!

LENTEN SERVICE DETAILS



I believe God is yearning for us to focus on prayer during Lent . Through prayer, many cool things can happen within us and among us. We live in busy, frustrating, frightening, lonely, & superficial times. Stopping to actually pray meaningfully from our hearts, with reflection and listening silence, we can rediscover who we are, what we are really feeling, and feel more connected to God and the purpose for which he has made us.

During each prayer-rich service on Wednesday evenings, I am inviting a lay person, whether young, old, or in the middle, to consider sharing a "testimony" about their experience with prayer. The purpose is to help us all gain insight into what prayer actually looks like in real people in real life. A "testimony" just means sharing your experience with prayer in a **story format as you might with a friend**. It does not need to be long, just 5-10 minutes.


Here are some sample ideas you could use to structure your story:

- My struggles with praying are ...
- Here is my story of how I learned to pray ...
- An experience of prayer being answered and how it impacted you or others
- An experience where a delay or lack of answer you wanted helped you to grow
- Your experience of what being prayed for is like
- Here is what I sound like when I pray (act out how you really pray can be funny)
- When I pray and why

These examples are in no particular order or priority and other ideas are welcomed!

BRINGING BACK PRE COVID YOUTH FAITH FORMATON

Dear Friends in Christ,

I wanted to share our vision for faith formation for our children and youth moving forward. In the past, we Lutherans as a whole, have tended to see faith formation as key events to "get done" and then take up a distant orbit around our church until a crisis happens. The outcome of this mindset is that our youth are losing saving faith and their connection to churches at a rate of 2/3rds, up from 1/3rd when I was confirmed many, many orbits around the sun ago:). Current generations have no attachment to organizations as compared to past generations. They are hungry for authentic relationships with people. Sadly, falling away from active faith tends to result in increased suffering and coping troubles during the lives of the youth over time.

In an effort to see the odds of our youth retaining faith for life, and thus have better odds of coping better through the rough times, we are going to be implementing a new paradigm. The basic idea is that the whole process is for the purpose of bringing the children and youth to a place where they have a strong personal relationship with Jesus, an active prayer life, and active participation in the life of the church.

Here is a summary:

- 1. Baptism (Seek this sacrament for kids at any age at which parents intend to have their kids participate in the life of the church or when high school youth want to participate in the life of the church when family participation is lacking). There is no point in or long term benefit from having a child baptized if they will not be participating in the life of the church.
- 2. JAM (pre-K-5th grade) as is now (JAM families, please let us know if having JAM during the 6:30pm worship service would help logistically with your other calendar commitments!)
- 3. First Communion (One session communion preparation classes will be available twice per year for kids in 2nd-5th grade as they show interest). The purpose is to help kids understand communion better and thus benefit from it more fully, so ideally before they start taking communion. Kids already taking communion will be able to go through the first communion classes if they want for the same reasons. They may continue taking communion without classes per their former process if their parents feel they understand it well enough.
- 4. Cross Training (6th-8th grade) as is now it involves both teaching and interactive discussion groups!
- 5. Foundations Class (8th grade) this will provide an introductory teaching on the core of our faith. Its purpose is to prepare youth to explore questions of faith during LIVE discussion groups the following few years and to prepare them for opportunities to participate in the life of the church community such as serving during worship. Unlike times in our past, the class will not be a "comprehensive confirmation test" indicating you are done growing. Rather, it is the beginning of a quest to understand and apply the faith more fully and more meaningfully in relationships!
- 6. LIVE (9th-12th grades) as is now it involves both teaching and interactive discussion groups!

- 7. Beginning a Personal Relationship with Jesus as Savior "at the foot of the cross" by choice as an older youth. Youth growing up without faith will experience a "conversion experience" when they hear the gospel and accept Jesus as their Savior for the 1st time as an <u>older</u> youth. For kids growing up with faith from childhood, their conversion experience is more of a conversion from a childhood faith to an adult faith. While both are saving faith, the latter involves both an increased understanding of the faith content (i.e. Foundations Class) **and** a sense of their relationship with God being their own, rather than that of their parents! Because this is about a personal relationship between the youth and God, "Come and see, follow me!" Jesus says to them, it is best to let it happen when it happens rather than forcing a specific time. Generally speaking, our culture sees 16 as an age when older youth can start making lasting significant decisions for themselves. Why force a life decision on a younger youth when they are not making those in general? You will know when they have experienced this when your youth truly believes Jesus saved them from their sins "at the cross", when they can pray, desire to grow in faith, can <u>begin</u> to articulate the core of the faith, ask thoughtful or application type of questions, and <u>begin</u> to serve others. In other words, when it matters to them from within, when they begin choosing spiritual things when given a choice, and see their identity as a child of God and as a follower of Jesus. Don't expect perfection since we, as adults, are not either:).
- 8. Affirmation of Faith. This ceremony, historically called confirmation or affirmation of faith, will now celebrate youth experiencing a Personal Relationship with Jesus as an older youth rather than the completion of educational classes at a mandatory age. Remember, the goal of the whole faith formation process is to lead them to Jesus on the cross and let Jesus lead them forth from the empty tomb as *life-long followers and friends!* By restoring the relational model of discipleship Jesus gave us, we set our youth up to benefit from their faith in much deeper and more lasting ways. This, in turn, will help them cope better with distress and thus suffer less in this life! We adults will be able to stress a little less knowing our youth will be calling on the Lord in their distress and that they will never be truly alone:).
- 9. Young Adults Group (Starting in 2025 for post-Affirmation of Faith youth)

Lastly, about dates! Great question! Look for them on page 8 of the newsletter. As always, please reach out with questions, ideas, and concerns. Remember, this is about us working together to be able to truly fulfill our baptismal vows to one another!

Baskets or items to add to a basket can be brought to church and placed in Jenny's office.






A VIA DE CRISTO WEEKEND IS THREE DAYS LONG... BUT LASTS A LIFETIME There is nothing secret about Via de Cristo (Way of Christ). 


