Dear Friends,

Easter is March 31st this year!

Last month, I wrote about denying ourselves to take up our crosses as we follow Jesus carrying his cross to Calvary for our salvation. This month, we will gather at the foot of his cross on Good Friday, and then, on Easter Sunday, we will gather at a puzzling place, his empty tomb. The tomb was in a well kept area since Mary of Magdalene thought the gardener had come to talk with her. A gardener? A GARDENER!

Her grieving shock that Jesus, the Messiah, could really be dead gave way to amazement that Jesus was really alive! When she saw him, she did not see the brutalized mess of a man she saw firsthand tortured and crucified on a cross. Instead, she saw someone who looked fully renewed, dressed for gardening, someone she recognized as she wiped the tears from her eyes and heard the tender, perhaps even playful inflection in his voice as he spoke her name, "Mary."

Her response was one of bewilderment, relief, and joy! She immediately flung herself at him, whether clasping his feet as others had in the past or perhaps an "I am so glad you're back" type hug, we do not know. What matters is that she believed, that she clung to him for life!


Mary, in a garden with the reality of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil represented by the tombs in the garden, saw the reality of the other tree, the tree of life! The reality of that tree was represented in the form of Jesus, the resurrected one! He was not just revived as one can be in an ER, his flogging wounds were gone! No! He was resurrected, made fully new! Mortality had given way to immortality! The gift of eternal life in bodily form presented to Adam and Eve had been restored to humanity. Unlike Eve, Mary chose life, the tree of Life, Jesus. In contrast to Eve, Mary went to the disciples to encourage them to choose the tree of life this time too!

The God who walked with humans in the Garden of Eden, was now once again walking with humans in a garden. The first walk turned gardens into graves through human sin, the second walk turned graves into gardens by the death and resurrection of Jesus! Now is the day to choose the gift of life, the gift standing before you, Jesus the resurrected one! This same Jesus has promised to come once more to take believers into the eternal garden on the new earth, where the river of life flows through the tree of life, which provides fruit all year long, forever!

WORSHIP PLANT UPDATE



A quick explanation on how the poinsettia and lily contribution works. We reserve a total of 12 flowers from Spencer FFA, about 45 days before the holiday. Because we have room to place 12 potted plants in the altar area safely for communion distribution that is the number we order. We pay \$12 to \$16 for the plants depending on what the FFA charges. We have a contribution form that members use to contribute towards the plants with a suggested donation price that is less than what we pay to purchase each plant. For the most part, what we receive in contributions is enough to equally cover what we owe the FFA. If the total contribution given exceeds our purchase price, Pam in the office then contacts the FFA to try to get more flowers. After the holiday worship service, the congregation is encouraged to take their plant home. Usually, there are 2 to 3 plants that are left at church, so 12 seems to be a good fit. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Pam in the office.


